AWARD RULES

The Stoynov Memorial Medal has been established by the International Symposium on Electrochemical Impedance Analysis (EIA) to honor one of its founding members, the late Professor Zdravko Stoynov, for his numerous advancements in the field of electrochemical impedance.

- The award recognizes the outstanding contribution of a living individual in the field of electrochemical impedance analysis for a single development or for overall achievements and is given at each triennial EIA Symposium.
- The award is donated by the Symposium and the family of Prof. Zdravko Stoynov.
- The award recipient is announced via the Symposium website.
- The award recipient receives a medal, a certificate, full conference participation coverage (travel, accommodation, and registration fee for the EIA Symposium at which the award is presented), and an invitation to give a plenary lecture at the EIA Symposium at which the award is presented.
- Nominations are solicited by the EIA Award Selection Committee (ASC). Candidates for the award can be proposed by institutes, university departments, companies, and individuals working in the field.
- The nominations (1000 words or less) should describe the relevant contribution(s) of the individual and must be accompanied by one letter of support. All documents must be sent by mail in PDF format to the Chair of the ASC within the nomination period.
- The Award Selection Committee consists of five persons: The Chair or one of the Co-chairs of the current EIA Symposium, the Chair or one of the co-chairs of the previous EIA Symposium, and three members nominated by the Chair of the current Symposium.
